2 Samuel chronicles the forty-year reign of King David, the man who lived at the halfway point between Abraham and Jesus Christ. David's triumphs bring the nation of Israel to its very high point of power. But his dual sins of adultery and murder bring personal and national chastening from the Lord.

Galatians – this letter from Paul has been called “the charter of Christian liberty.” It is Paul’s declaration of justification by faith and the liberty it produces. Certain Jewish legalists are seeking to influence the new believers in Galatia to trade their freedom in Christ for bondage to the Law.
