

## November 2022 Bible Reading Plan

**Psalm (Book Three)** - is a collection of five books containing 150 poems. The third book, which we will read from this month, is found in Psalms 73-89. Throughout the Psalms, we find situations that indicate distress, yet statements of confidence in the God who alone can deliver.

**1 Corinthians** – Corinth was the leading commercial center of southern Greece and infamous for its immorality and paganism. In spite of many obstacles, Paul was able to plant a Christian church in Corinth on his second missionary journey (Acts 18:1-17). Though gifted and growing, the church was plagued with problems. Paul writes his letter to address some of these problems, as well as to answer some crucial questions asked by those believers in Corinth.
