**James** – “proverbs of the New Testament” it has been called. Faith without works cannot be called faith. Faith must move into action.

**Joshua** – the first of the twelve historical books (Joshua-Esther). The first half (1-12) describes the seven-year conquest of the land; the second half (13-24) describes the partitioning and settlement of the land.

**Jude** –

**Obadiah** – fighting between twin brothers (Esau and Jacob, Gen. 27) leads to national enmity between their respective people (Edomites and Israelites) and the destruction of Edom and the vindication of Israel.

**Jude** – the dangers of false doctrine and rebellion and how to overcome them.
