2 Kings – the twin kingdoms of Israel and Judah are on a collision course with captivity as the once United Kingdom dissolves. God’s patience is long and his pleading is persistent, but when ignored, God’s love can be severe.

2 Corinthians – after Paul’s first letter, the Corinthian church had been swayed by false teachers who set the people against Paul. Paul then sent Titus to address the issues. Paul writes this letter giving thanks for the repentant majority and to appeal to the minority to accept his authority.

Amos – a country farmer turned prophet, Amos prophesied during a period of optimism in Israel, but below the surface, greed, hypocrisy and injustice were festering, which brought e message to repent and turn from their hypocrisy and spiritual apathy.
