

December 2023 Bible Reading Plan

2 Chronicles – parallels 1 and 2 Kings though it simply ignores the northern kingdom of Israel due to its false worship and refusal to acknowledge the temple in Jerusalem. The temple and temple worship are dominant throughout the book. The book focuses on those kings who pattern their life and reign after king David. The time span covers the beginning of Solomon's temple and concludes with Cyrus' edict to rebuild the temple more than four hundred years later.

Luke – the gospel record that presents Jesus as the Savior of the world, not merely of the Jews. Theophilus was probably a Gentile, and nuances found in Luke's gospel (i.e., Samaritans highlighted along with Roman centurion) seem to indicate that his aim was primarily toward the Gentile world. Luke's gospel was probably written sometime during A.D. 60-61.
