Nehemiah – a contemporary of Ezra, Nehemiah is concerned for the welfare of Jerusalem and leads the people to rebuild the shattered walls of Jerusalem.

Joel – a locust plague has devastated the nation of Judah, but worse is coming unless the people genuinely repent.

Micah – prophesied of future destruction and captivity. But the future of a Divine Deliverer gives hope.

Nahum – 150 years after Jonah’s message to Nineveh to repent, Nahum now prophesies that time has run out for God’s patience, judgment is coming.

Zechariah – not just building a structure, but building a future.

2 Timothy – Paul’s last will and testament to his spiritual son.
