

June 2024 Bible Reading Plan

Luke – the gospel record that presents Jesus as the Savior of the world, not merely of the Jews. Theophilus was probably a Gentile, and nuances found in Luke’s gospel (i.e. Samaritans highlighted along with Roman centurion) seem to indicate that his aim was primarily toward the Gentile world. Luke’s gospel was probably written sometime during A.D. 60-61.

Psalms is a collection of five books containing 150 poems. The first book, which we will read from this month, is found in Psalms 1-41 and a majority of the psalms in this book are written by David. Here we find situations that indicate distress, yet statements of confidence in the God who alone can deliver.
