**Ezekiel** – a priest and a prophet who prophesies among the Jewish exiles in Babylon during darkest days of Judah’s history and downfall. Ezekiel is a man of visions that stretch from horror to hope. Present judgment will be followed by future glory.

**1 Timothy** – as an aged and experienced apostle, Paul is writing to a young Timothy who is carrying a heavy burden of responsibility in the church at Ephesus. The task before him: false doctrine must be erased, public worship must be protected, and mature leadership developed. Timothy is to stand strong in character and lead out of godliness.
